Thank you for your desire to serve as a Honduras Well Projects trip member! As you partner with God to serve people in Honduras, our prayer is that you and those you serve will be forever changed. To participate in a HWP trip, we require the completion and acceptance of the Trip Participant Agreement.

Trip Participant Agreement

The purpose of a HWP Service Trip is to provide an outlet for the body of Christ to serve one another and use each person's unique gifts to show God's love to the people of Honduras. The HWP standards are in place to ensure safety and a positive reputation is upheld by all our trip participants, partners and staff.

Please read the following policies carefully. In signing, you are agreeing that you will abide by all the following conditions. If you do not follow all these conditions, you may have your volunteer privileges immediately revoked, resulting in being sent home from the Service Trip immediately *and being liable for any additional costs for change in travel arrangements*.

1. I will not give personal gifts, whether cash or otherwise, to any individuals that I encounter during my Service Trip except for hygiene items, bibles, school supplies or small toys for children.

While we want to bless communities, we want to do so in a healthy and sustaining way so we ask any questions be directed to HWP prior to purchasing items for the trip.

- 2. I will not consume any form of alcohol while in-country on the Service Trip
- 3. I will abstain from using tobacco products except at the hotel after hours, and only then outdoors, and under the conditions allowed by the hotel.
- 4. In an effort to dress modestly, while outside the hotel I will refrain from wearing shorts or skirts above the knee, yoga pants, tank tops or shirts with sleeves cut off. If I have a tattoo that displays vulgarity, I will cover said tattoo. I will exercise modesty when choosing swimwear for the trip.
- 5. I will not pursue, reciprocate, or engage in any romantic relationships with staff or community members during the Service Trip.
- 6. I understand the need for grace and flexibility when working together in an unfamiliar culture. When dealing with conflict, I will handle it graciously and will attempt to quickly resolve any conflict that may arise.
